It is interesting and somewhat sad to note that Dr. King made that speech one hundred and two days after the official end of the Civil War.

Dr. King taught that "Darkness cannot drive out darkness, only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate, only love can do that". This quote appears in his 1963 book *Strength to Love*.
